PASTOR'S NOTES

Last weekend I joined our high school students and chaperones on a trip to Washington, DC for the Right to Life March. It was just an overnight, but we visited a number of sites and had the opportunity to discuss a variety of life issues from conception to natural death. On our itinerary, we celebrated Mass at the National Shrine of Our Lady of Lourdes in Emmitsburg, MD. We stopped for dinner in the Inner Harbor in Baltimore where we watched the Baltimore Ravens' Billy Cundiff miss a game-tying field goal. After the miss, I felt like I was having dinner in a morgue. I have never experienced anything quite like it. Aside from the mumbled death threats directed towards Cundiff, all conversations ceased.

After dinner we visited St. Mary's Seminary, the oldest seminary in the county, and were given a tour from our very own seminarians from the Diocese of Syracuse. The next day, our group and the other six busloads of students from around the Syracuse Diocese gathered at the National Shrine of the Immaculate Conception in Washington, DC for Mass celebrated by Bishop Cunningham. We left Mass and joined roughly half a million people to march for those unable to speak for themselves. Throughout our journey we prayed for an end to abortion and for the increase in respect for all life from conception to natural death.

As we pulled into Holy Family Monday night we brought back as many students as we took and nobody got hurt, which is the standard for a successful trip. I would like to thank the community for the support of the students' fundraising efforts that help make this trip and other Life Teen events possible. I believe all of our students learned a great deal and each were impacted by their experience. We are very blessed to have such a generous community that continually supports our youth, and we are blessed with outstanding young men and women who are willing to stand up for what they believe in.
