Jesus promised, "Whoever believes in Me... Rivers of living water will flow from within him, (John 7:37-38); and "I came that they may have life, and have it more abundantly," (John 10:10).

The RCIA process begins the journey of faith that leads to the fulfillment of our Lord's promises and is for all adults who:

1. Have never received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation and Jesus in the Eucharist and desire to, or;
 2. Have been baptized in a non-Catholic faith tradition but desire full communion in the Roman Catholic Church upon receiving Confirmation and Jesus in the Eucharist, or;
 3. Are already Catholic or non-Catholic Christians and desire to learn more about the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ.
