MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Silence and Transcendence

Dear Holy Family Parishioners and Friends,

Recently, I was reading an article that talked about the reality that people today, when it comes to their experience of Church, are looking for more silence and a sense of transcendence. This caught my attention because I grew up in a large, noisy household where my parents repeatedly said they desired, "peace and quiet." All kidding aside, our world has more noise and distractions than ever before and, I believe, lacks a sense of transcendence. So, I can understand why this is a desire of people coming to Church.

Silence. This is an easy one. Our world has so much noise. Think about it...we have televisions, iPads, laptops, cell phones, computers, social media, and the list goes on and on. Someone was sharing with me that they watch television, play games on their iPad, and text and scroll through social media all at the same time. We are inundated with noise. So much so that we don't even recognize it until it becomes quiet. Have you ever noticed how uncomfortable silence has become. Whenever there are moments of silence, there is a need almost to fill it with noise. It comes as no surprise that people desire silence when it comes to Church. In fact, some of the great saints and spiritual writers have said that God can be encountered in a powerful way in the silence. It gives us a chance to put all of the distractions aside and simply be in God's presence or to simply listen to God. It can be very moving and powerful. For many, Church is the only place where they can come for silence as life bombards us with so much noise.

Transcendence. This is the sense of being pulled out of this world and having an experience of the divine and the sacred. Again, our world can be very good at pulling us into our routines and getting caught up in the mundane of this world. This is not always a bad thing, but there are those times when we need something more. There are those times when we need to be lifted up from this world and experience that divine presence and to have a true experience of the sacred. Church is supposed to do that for us...to lift us from this world and give us that experience of he heavenly or the divine or the sacred. These are powerful moments for us when they happen, and these encounters leave us wanting more.

We will be looking at how we can create a reverence for silence and transcendence at Holy Family. I am not saying we have to be come monks, not speak, and profess a vow of silence, but I do think we have to be aware that many people come into God's house here seeking that silence and transcendence. Last week, a young adult was sitting alone in church when I came in to set up for Mass. The young person approached me and shared that they needed to come in and just be in the quiet. The person had been here for nearly an hour before I came in and just spent time in prayer – no cell phone, no distractions. The world around this young person – work, social media, emails, texting, calls, you name it – became a bit overwhelming and being quiet for an hour was what this person was craving. Let's pray that we can continue to provide that peace, quiet, and transcendence to all who come through our doors.

TO THOSE WHO BRING HOLY COMMUNION TO A FAMILY MEMBER OR NEIGHBOR

It is most important to always protect the sacredness of the consecrated host. The sacred host should be securely contained in a pyx and carried reverently, ideally in a burse. A burse is a small fabric case with a string to be worn around the neck. The pyx is placed into it to securely keep Jesus near your heart as you travel to your destination. A few burses are available to borrow in the Sacristy. Burses can also be found at the Catholic Shop or ordered online.

Remember to go directly after Mass to distribute the host(s). Errands or other activities should not take place while you're carrying the Blessed Sacrament or kept in your home for any length of time.

Holy Family provides a ministry to our folks who can't get to Mass. Lay ministers are available to make regular visits with Holy Communion. Contact the parish office if you would like more information.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

John 10: 11 - 18

It may not seem like a compliment to be a "sheep", but one of the most beloved images of Jesus is that of the Good Shepherd.

On Palm Sunday, we began Holy Week by greeting Christ as the Son of David. David was the greatest king of Israel, but as a boy, he had been a humble shepherd. Throughout the Old Testament, the metaphor appears, and in Ezekiel 34, the Lord himself says "I myself will shepherd them". Several centuries later, the Jewish people were still suffering under bad leaders like Herod Antipas.

In this context, Jesus makes one of his "I AM" statements from John's Gospel: I am the Good Shepherd." I will show them the way into life and truth. Unlike the Pharisees and others, he is not lacking in affirmation. He has the love of the Father, so he is free to give his life out of love for us. He emphasizes that "no one takes it from me". The Roman and religious authorities did not know what they were doing, but Christ could lay down his life.

For me as a priest, this image presents a challenging but comforting model for ministry. In 1994, Pope John Paul II wrote on the priesthood "I Will Give You Shepherds". I am grateful to many inspirations, from my pastor Fr. Howard in Mooers Forks, to Benedict XVI. Amid the wolves, we still can follow the Good Shepherd. I like to read books, but where I really learn is from the lives of my people, bringing me hope in anxiety and temptation. We don't know the future God has for us, and as I have been saying for these past few months, I hope to remain and share our lives together.
