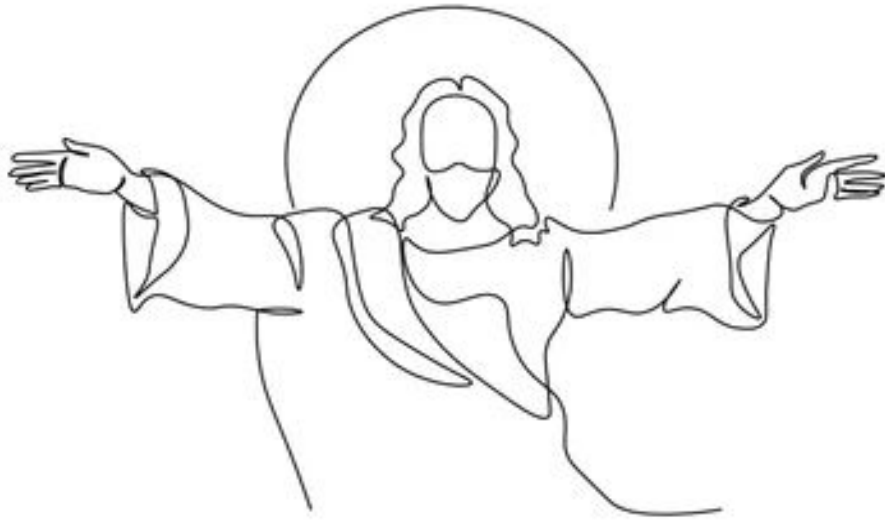

MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Holy Family Parishioners and Friends,

Safety is always a priority at Holy Family Church. Over the past eight years that I have been at Holy Family, we have had ongoing conversations that lead to concrete action. Due to the reality that we are all experiencing - the growing number of incidents around our country of shootings, vandalism, and crime - this is an issue that will continually be discussed. These discussions have to lead to action and increased safety measures.

Over the past eight years we have worked diligently to ensure the safety of our school children, our parishioners, and all who come to our church, school, and offices. I want to highlight some of the things we have done. At Holy Family School, we have installed safety film on all lower-level windows. This allows anyone inside to see outside, but those outside cannot see inside. Our school has panic buttons and security cameras. Our school has plans for active shooters and other incidents that may arise. There is only one drop-off entry to the school which limits the number of entry points for someone to enter the school. These are just a few of the many measures in our school. In terms of the church, we have security cameras all over the outside and inside of the church. There are panic buttons in the church that directly alert 911 to an emergency. Our doors have a lockdown button, which locks all of the doors down in an instant in case there was someone we didn't want in the church. All of the doors are equipped with crash bars, so anyone can get out even if the church is on lockdown. I believe that we are the only church around that has a Safety Team to help make sure safety is a priority. In the parish offices and rectory, we have alarm systems, buttons, and other measures to protect our staff and clergy.

As you can see, we have quite a bit in place for our safety and protection. Even with all that we have, there is still more to be done. I have been meeting over the past few weeks with people involved in ministry, our school principal, and professionals to see what more we can do. I don't think we have to live in fear and I don't think our campus should become a prison. However, I do believe strongly that all of us need to be safe and feel safe. We need to do all we can to make this a reality. Thank you for your help and support. Please know that all suggestions are welcome.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 24:13-35

I hate to say it, but the older I get the more forgetful I become. Just ask my wife and she will tell you I speak the truth. As I read our Gospel from Luke today, I was reminded how sometimes that we forget that the good Lord is often walking side by side with us when we are oblivious to his presence, or worse yet, life and the world around us gets in our way and our vision and attitude is sometimes overcome by discouragement and doubt about His presence in our lives.

That is what those two doubting disciples were feeling that day as they traveled on foot to the town of Emmaus. They were conversing and debating about what had happened to Jesus and what the women had reported to them from the tomb. They had seen all his works and listened to his teachings and witnessed his miracles, and yet it took Jesus to appear to them to dispel their doubt, confusion and discouragement. It was the sacramental act of breaking bread with them that they finally realized that it was in fact the Risen Lord before them.

When we experience that doubt and discouragement about the Lord's presence in our lives, look no further than the Eucharist and prayer. It is there that you will always find him and where he reveals to you his perfect plan for each and every one of us. Be open to the gift of understanding by trusting that the wisdom of God will dispel every temptation and doubt, replacing it with trust and hope. Remember, God is my savior; I trust in him and shall not fear.
