Initial Training Sessions: Wednesday, September 6 or Tuesday, September 19.

Re-Certification Training Sessions: Tuesday, Sept. 12 or Wednesday, Sept. 27.

The diocesan Child and Youth Protection policy requires completing the initial Safe Environment training session upon the assumption of duties, employment, or volunteering whose ministry or role places them in regular contact with children, young people, or vulnerable adults. Re-certification every five years is required if you remain active in your ministry.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 17: 1 - 9

This weekend we reflect upon Jesus' transfiguration. Without a doubt, this must have left a vivid and lifelong memory with Peter, James, and John.

Prior to this story we hear the Pharisees and Sadducees press Jesus for a sign proving his true identity. We also hear Jesus ask his disciples who they thought he was. Jesus had every opportunity to showcase his identity to countless people and end all this speculation. Why then did he choose to lead only Peter, James, and John up the mountain that day?

Perhaps part of the reason was that Jesus was helping to prepare them for the hardships they would inevitably face. We are told that after hearing the voice of God the Father, the disciples "fell prostrate and were very much afraid."

I can only speak for myself but, there are countless moments daily where I am "very much afraid." The stress and anxiety of life creeps in and the world feels like a very scary place. But today we remember that Jesus came to the disciples and said "rise, and do not be afraid." And when they looked up, "they saw no one else but Jesus alone."

Jesus does not reveal himself to us to showcase his power or to acquire the most followers. Perhaps Jesus reveals himself to us subtly to remind us that he is the true "Son of the living God" and that he is with us always - in times of good and during times of fear. Together, let us respond to Jesus who comes to us, personally reaching out his hand, and asking us to rise up and not be afraid.
