GOSPEL REFLECTION

Luke 2: 16-21

It's early in the morning and the alarm clock goes off. You hit snooze. Another 10 minutes of peace and quiet, until inevitably, "Beep! Beep! Beep!" Another alarm. You slog out of your bed and make your way through your morning routine. As the song goes, "Another Day, Another Dollar."

I don't know about you, but I am not a morning person. Waking up at the sound of an alarm doesn't come easy to me. So this new year, that's my new commitment. Every time I hear the alarm in the morning, the first time, I'm committing to waking up and starting my day with "haste" for whatever is ahead of me.

In the Gospel this weekend, we read this verse:
