MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Friends,

Happy Super Bowl Sunday! I know there will be many watching as the Philadelphia Eagles take on the Kansas City Chiefs! Even if your team is not in it, or you just don't like football, you'll probably watch the Super Bowl commercials.

Recently, I saw a statistic that, on average, over 100 million people watch the Super Bowl each year. According to the Neilson Ratings, 70% of homes in the United States, with a television, tune into the Super Bowl. Forbes Magazine reported that, on social media, there are around 45 million interactions regarding the Super Bowl. No matter what our opinion is of the Super Bowl, I think we would all agree that, according to the statistics above, people "talk up" this game. People get together to watch the game, they talk about the game in the weeks leading up to it and for weeks after the game, and they come together on social media to talk about the game, the commercials, and the halftime show. It could be said that people put a lot of stock into this game.

Sometimes as I watch the Super Bowl, perhaps the biggest supporting event of the year, I think to myself, "Imagine if the same amount of hype and enthusiasm that surrounds the Super Bowl existed over going to Mass and receiving Jesus Christ in the Eucharist! Imagine if over the course of a weekend if 100 million people went to Mass in our country and there were 45 million social media posts about the Eucharist and Jesus being present to us. When I think about that, I am reminded that I have to "step up my game" and be sure that I talk up my faith in Jesus Christ a 100 million times more, or 70% more, of 45 million times more than I do now! May the best team win! Happy Super Bowl Sunday!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 5: 17-37

In our Gospel today, after first proclaiming the Beatitudes and then calling the disciples salt and light, Jesus now continues his Sermon on the Mount by teaching his disciples a new way of observing the commandments. His way of approaching the ancient law is not to throw it out but rather fulfill it, which is in keeping with Jesus's ministry in general.

Jesus wants us to look not merely "at the commandment" and the actions which the commandment either permits or prohibits, but he also wants us to scrutinize our intentions and the movements of our own hearts. For example, the first law Jesus addresses is murder. Jesus looks at the law and suggests that this commandment also calls for the elimination of anger which would eventually cause someone to kill another. But he goes further and says we have to look at the anger in one's heart and not simply overturn it, but it also must include reconciliation with the other. It asks us not simply to refrain from an evil action, but we must identify and correct the root causes for this evil action in the first place. Jesus asks us to live out the commandments..." and then some."

It is in the "and then some" that Jesus asks us to dive deeper and if we are going to truly embrace the Gospel teaching of Jesus, you have to be willing to go deeper in your faith and allow God into parts of your lives that you may have "put a lock" on. Because if you do, you will find that new life is a life of fullness of love, mercy, surrender, zeal, conversion and transformation! Jesus asks each of us to go past the old and limited righteousness of the scribes and Pharisees, and I promise if you do, that God will do "and then some" in each of your lives!
