GOSPEL REFLECTION

Mark 1: 29 - 39

Being sick, whether it is a mild case of the sniffles or a down and out illness, doesn't tend to bring out the best in us. We are not always pleasant and may become more irrational than we are on our better days. And no one suffers this backlash more than the caretakers who are just trying to help.

My son hates taking medicine. No matter how poorly he is feeling or what the ailment is, he will not take medication without an extensive amount of cajoling first – and that is only if I am lucky enough to convince him at all. I am not sure why and he is not able to put a reason into words either. Is it fear of the medication itself? Is it the potential taste that intimidating? Is he just satisfied wallowing in his own suffering? Who knows?! But as his parent I desperately want him to take the medicine and feel better.

When reflecting on the healing we see take place in this week's gospel, I am reminded of this parenting struggle. God – the ultimate parent - wants to provide us comfort and healing in all our life's struggles. He wants us to 'take the medicine' and trust that he knows what we need to heal. Too often, we hold back - depriving ourselves of this healing. Maybe we are withholding forgiveness of others or of ourselves. Perhaps we fall into the habit of negative thinking. We might find ourselves distracted by what is not our purpose What is holding you back from being open to that healing?
