MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Holy Family Parishioners and Friends,

Merry Christmas and Happy New Year! I hope and pray you're continuing to celebrate Christmas with joy and enthusiasm and that your New Year is off to a great start.

I want to share with you a topic of significant importance. In late 2023, Bishop Lucia asked pastors to look at ways for parishes to work together. In our area, a meeting was held, and many discussions took place regarding how parishes can work together now and in the future. This is due to a clergy shortage and, post-COVID, the number of people going to Mass is down (this is true of every parish). Hopefully, we all recognize these realities. We simply do not have the number of priests we used to have and the number of people going to Church and receiving the sacraments has declined.

As we enter 2024 there will be continued meetings on how we can collaborate with other parishes in our area. There will be conversations about Mass schedules, sharing resources, and doing all we can to provide pastoral care for souls in the best way possible. You may ask, "How will this impact me or us here at Holy Family Church?" Ultimately, I do not know right now. All I can say is that I will keep you posted as we move through this process and I ask for your openness, understanding, and support. It might mean adjusting our Mass schedule for weekends and weekdays. It might mean that we share programs and other resources with other parishes. Again, I will share with you all that is discussed and takes place. The one thing I do know is that we do not have enough priests now to cover all of our parishes and, if you look around at every church, there are a lot of empty pews. These conversations have taken place in the past, but now there has to be concrete action moving forward.

Let's continue to pray for each other and pray that God will lead us and guide us through this process.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 2: 1 - 12

Today's feast of the Epiphany makes known the story of the Magi looking up into the dark sky and seeing a bright star. We see them choosing to follow the star, wherever it might lead, and it brings them to the Lord.

Most of us enjoy looking up at the stars and might recall moments of profound peace and quiet as we gazed at the heavens on a clear summer's night. Have we ever reflected, though, on the simple fact about stars, they they can be seen only against a backdrop of darkness?

As we close the Christmas season, many of us wish the Christmas spirit could last all year, that each day of the year were full of high spirits and peace. Wouldn't it be nice if there were no bad news and no sadness? In other words, we would love to have stars without the darkness! The truth is we can't have one without the other but we can choose which one we look at.

Faith-filled people have their share of finding faults and setbacks as anyone else. What makes them effective, though, is they generally concentrate on the light rather than on the darkness. If we want to find fault with others or reflect on the bad things in our lives, we will. If we look for the good points, we're sure to find them.

Life is made or broken by what we consistently choose to look at: the stars or the darkness. Like the Magi, we can choose the stars!
