GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 2: 1-12

Today we celebrate a familiar story, the Epiphany of the Lord. Magi from the East follow a star as it leads them to Bethlehem where they find the infant Jesus.

If you are anything like me, as I wait for something, I can't help but imagine what it will be like when that moment finally arrives. Maybe it is something big like Christmas or something smaller like a new movie coming out. Either way, I usually have some expectations. The Magi's long journey most certainly offered them time to reflect upon what they might encounter when they finally found Jesus.

Epiphany means "a moment of sudden revelation or insight." Can you imagine the surprise when they finally encountered Jesus? A child wrapped in swaddling clothes, born in a small town, to a humble family. Their expectations must have been quite different! I'm certain the magi were provided with great insight into truths about Jesus based on what they found.

Did this Christmas season match **our** expectations? In some ways yes and in other ways probably not.

What were the insights God provided **us** during the Advent and Christmas seasons? Let's spend some time reflecting on those personal Epiphanies provided just for us.

At the close of today's reading, we are told that the Magi "departed for their country by another way." After encountering the infant Jesus they were changed. Their return path symbolizes this change - noting that we can never be the same after an encounter with Jesus. How will we let the Epiphanies provided to us this year impact our lives? Let's together choose to return home a different way!
