# **GOSPEL REFLECTION**

#### Matthew 13: 1 - 23

Do you think that you could be one of the disciples that would understand the teachings of Jesus, and be blessed as he says those who do, are? Do you think that if speaking in parables is easy to do, the listening parts should also be easy to understand? Well let me tell you, I think this humble sinner would have gotten a grade of D minus, as even today, it seems really hard to put myself in their shoes and literally walk a mile!

I can vividly remember being in High School needing to take and pass Chemistry. What I could not simply grasp was the basic concepts that made up the tenants of that science. Sure, like everyone else, I could memorize the Periodic Table of Elements, but when it came time for tests, I always got horrible grades. So, I thought of enlisting the help of the best Chemistry Professor I could think of, - My Dad!

You see my Dad was a Senior Research Chemist for Occidental Chemical and it was he from whom I sought help. Like the Apostles who asked Jesus to break open his words, I asked My Dad for help in learning these concepts, but something still could not get through this thick skull to understand the work laid out before me. Was he speaking a foreign language? Was I just stupid when it came to Science? OR- was it a case that I simply needed to work harder at my homework and ask God for help. Well, Thanks be to God, I actually passed that exam, but I'll not tell what the grade was for it's really not about me! Jesus, in all his teachings, tried to simply share with others the love and mercy of his Heavenly Father. That in spite of some failures made in our humanity because of opposition and indifference, the message about the coming of Gods kingdom will have enormous success. Knowledge of the mysteries of the kingdom of heaven means recognition that the kingdom has become present in the ministry of Jesus.

The four types of persons envisioned by Jesus in our readings are 1) those who never accept THE WORD of the kingdom; 2) those who believe for a while, but fall away because of persecution, 3) those who believe, but in whom THE WORD is choked out by world anxiety and the allurement of riches and then, 4) those who respond to THE WORD and produce fruit abundantly. Which one of these people or groups best describes you today and which one should we strive to attain?
