JOIN SEMINARIAN JOHN BRUSA FOR CANDIDACY

As some may know, Seminarian John Brusa (originally from Holy Family) has been on his pastoral year in Cortland. In the Diocese of Syracuse, pastoral year typically “culminates” in the Rite of Admission to Candidacy for Holy Orders. This rite is simply a public declaration that one intends to finish his studies for the priesthood. On the Feast of St. James, Tuesday July 25th, at St. Mary’s Church in Cortland, Bishop Lucia will celebrate a mass in which John and his classmate Joseph Ryan are both recognized as candidates for Holy Orders. The mass will begin at 6:30pm. All are welcome. This is a great way to celebrate our seminarians as they prepare to return to their studies.

The diocesan Child and Youth Protection policy requires completing the initial Safe Environment training session upon the assumption of duties, employment, or volunteering whose ministry or role places them in regular contact with children, young people, or vulnerable adults. Re-certification every five years is required if you remain active in your ministry.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 11: 25 - 30

Today's Gospel should give all of us pause and really think about what Jesus is saying to us. It's actually taken from a section of Matthew's Gospel sometimes called the "mission discourse" and should get your attention and communicate a very deep truth about how we are called to live our lives.

What Jesus is talking about here is discipleship, but radical discipleship. We are told that that we are to love Jesus more than father or mother and son or daughter. We must take up the cross and follow Jesus, event to death. Wow! That's indeed radical. But here's the thing: as radical as this call to discipleship is, its success depends on a connection to a ministry of hospitality. That was Jesus's point.

Essentially, this Gospel teaches that those who live in a selfish, self-centered way do not accomplish their goal. The goal of those who are selfish is to elevate themselves with the thinking that this is what is best for them. But Jesus clearly points out that when you live selfishly, seeking to put yourself above others, you lose what is most important in life. You lose your very soul. On the contrary, if you live selflessly, putting others before you, it is in this act that you actually find your true purpose in life and fulfill yourself on the deepest level and truly know Jesus is love itself! And his love is always self-giving.

So, if we insist on holding onto what we value in our daily lives, Jesus says we will lose it. But if we perform acts of hospitality, even if only a cup of water for the least of God's children, we will receive God's reward. And in that simple radical act of selfless love, you will discover and become who you were created to be.
