MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Holy Family Parishioners and Friends,

For your planning purposes, I want to share with you our Holy Week/Easter Schedule. We will have The Light is On Confessions from 4-6:30 p.m. on Holy Monday. On Holy Thursday we will have morning prayer at 9 a.m. and The Mass of the Lord's Supper at 6 p.m. with adoration to follow until 11 p.m.. On Good Friday there will be morning prayer at 9 a.m. and the Commemoration of the Lord's Passion will be at 3 p.m. The church will be left open for silent prayer following the service. On Holy Saturday there will be morning prayer at 9 a.m. with the blessing of the Easter food immediately following morning prayer. The Easter Vigil Mass is at 8 p.m. On Easter Sunday Masses will be at 6 a.m. (Sunrise Mass at the Shrine), 7:30 a.m., 9:00 a.m., and 10:30 a.m.. There will be no 4 p.m. Mass on Easter Sunday. It has been the custom at Holy Family not to have this Mass so everyone can enjoy Easter dinner with their families.

I invite you to make note of the fact that we have the Easter Sunday Sunrise Mass at the Shrine at 6 a.m.. Please bring your lawn chair. If there is inclement weather, the Mass will be moved into the church. As long as there is not a blizzard or extreme cold temperatures, the Mass will be at the Shrine. We have been doing this Mass at the Shrine for about 5 years now and everyone has said that it is beautiful. Since there is no Sunrise Mass at Burnet Park this year (at least at the time of this writing), I would encourage you to spread the word!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

John 4:5-42

In the Gospel this weekend, we learn the story of a woman who has had many husbands. She is a person who has truly been searching, indeed, thirsting for love throughout her entire life. When we meet her in the story, she has come to a place to quench her thirst, the well, and there she encounters Jesus for the very first time. When they meet, Jesus explains to her, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, but whoever drinks the water I shall give will never thirst."

How often have we been like this woman? We thirst and we search for love, and then, just when we think we have found what will satisfy us, we are left thirsting and searching for more. Instead, how can we take the opportunity to drink from the well of living water? The living water that will be "a spring of water welling up to eternal life." This is the love that Jesus provides to all of us, and it is what he revealed to the woman at the well in this weekend's Gospel story.

Friends, thirst no longer. Stop searching. The love of Christ is here for you, and this love satisfies you forever. Come to the well and ask Jesus to give you a drink.
