GOSPEL REFLECTION

John 9: 1-41

When Patty gave birth to our oldest son, he was born with an issue that required him to spend 3 months in the hospital. Anyone who has cared for a loved one in the hospital knows of the stress and time commitment this brings.

One thing that helped us get through this difficult time were the kind actions of others. Meals left on our doorstep, people stopping to care for our dog, cards, social media messages, and countless prayers for our son.

In this weekend's Gospel reading Jesus heals a man who was born blind. Jesus could have healed the man through a spoken word but instead chose physical action using spittle, clay, and water. Jesus chose to perform this action on the Sabbath when work was forbidden, not waiting for a convenient time, but instead acting when opportunity arrived.

We, too, are called to follow Jesus and act in tangible ways to help others. Serving others not just when convenient, but in their moment of need, can literally change a life. Remembering, too, as Mother Teresa said that "it is not the magnitude of our actions but the amount of love that is put into them that matters."

After his encounter, the man is sent to the pool where he gains sight and shares his great news with others. Similarly, the kindness shown to Patty and I tangibly allowed us to feel God's presence in our lives. We wanted to spread His love with everyone we encountered. One kind act does not end there.

Is there anyone in your life that could use a small act of service? It could literally change their life - and the lives of others.
