

GOSPEL REFLECTION

John 17: 1-11

This weekend's Gospel reading captures the essence of Jesus' mission on earth and his relationship with his Father. In this passage, Jesus prays for himself, his disciples, and all believers, asking for their protection and unity.

One of the striking things about this passage is the way Jesus speaks to his Father. He addresses him as "Father," indicating the close and intimate relationship he has with God. Jesus also acknowledges that his mission on earth is to glorify God, and that he has completed the work his Father gave him. This shows us that Jesus is completely obedient to God's will and is committed to fulfilling his purpose on earth.

Jesus also prays for his disciples, asking that they be kept safe from the evil one and that they may be united in love. This prayer is a reminder that Jesus' mission was not just about himself, but also about those who would follow him and continue his work after he was gone. He wants his disciples to be united in love, just as he is united with his Father.

I am struck by the power of prayer and the importance of unity among believers. Jesus' prayer for unity reminds us that we are all part of the same body of Christ, and that we should strive to work together and love one another despite our differences. This passage also reminds me of the importance of obedience to God's will, just as Jesus was obedient to his Father's will.

Let us all be reminded this weekend of the intimate relationship between Jesus and his Father, the importance of prayer, and the need for unity among believers. And let us all be challenged to be obedient to God's will and to work together in love for the glory of God.
