GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 25: 1 - 13

The first reading in the Gospel for this weekend at Mass encourages us to seek out a formula for acquiring wisdom. The first reading tells us that those who live wise are promised an enhanced and more carefree life. Sounds good to me! The Gospel reading follows with a story of the good fortune of the five wise maidens and the bad consequences for the five foolish ones.

Most of us who seek a better life have respect for wisdom and wish we had more of it. It bothers us when we can't make up our minds or when we make silly mistakes or bad decisions that have unfortunate consequences. We may envy wise people who seem more stable and well-adjusted. They don't appear overwhelmed by their problems. They don't even seem to run into the problems we might face repeatedly. So, it seems that wisdom is essential for effective living. But how is wisdom attained?

First of all, it's important for us to realize that wisdom does not come with age or being clever, book-smart, or well-educated. People with advanced academic degrees can live in constant turmoil while those with minimal formal education can be the most put-together and productive.

Second, it's important to realize there is no big mystery to acquiring wisdom. It simply requires that we stop and think, that we weigh the consequences of our decisions, and that we accept full responsibility for our actions. It also requires we learn from our mistakes and resolve not to repeat them.

It sounds like a fairly straightforward formula for acquiring wisdom, but as with most things in life, it requires our patience and determination!
