The Month of All Souls

All Souls Day is celebrated on November 2, and it is a time for us to pray for all the souls of the faithful departed. I think it is beneficial for us to take the entire month to pray for the souls of those who have died. It is one of the spiritual works of mercy. Perhaps, during November, we can all set aside a few moments each day and remember someone who has died (or maybe more than one person). You could pray a Rosary for them or an Our Father or Hail Mary...the important thing is that we pray for them. Another thing we can do is visit the cemetery and pray for the dead. I had the opportunity the other day to pray at my parents' grave in Fulton. I wanted to be sure to get there before the cemetery is closed for the winter months (they do this in Fulton because of the large amount of snow). For those who visit the cemetery from November 1 - 8, there is a plenary indulgence that you receive if you pray for the dead, pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, go to confession, and receive Holy Communion. It is important for us to pray for and remember the dead. Let's make it part of our spiritual journey this month. Eternal rest grant unto them, O Lord. And let perpetual light shine upon them.

Through your gift, you reveal Jesus to others in our seven-county Diocese. Thank you for bringing Jesus to others and thank you for sharing your faith and being an inspiration to so many!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 23: 1 - 12

My friends, in this weekend's Gospel, we hear Our Blessed Lord advise his followers against the hypocrisy of the Scribes and the Pharisees. One thing that particularly struck me in the Gospel is when Jesus reminds his listeners (and that includes us) that "The greatest among you must be your servant.

Whoever exalts himself will be humbled; but whoever humbles himself will be exalted." This is so opposite from the typical way in which our society looks at greatness. In our world, greatness is seen as ruling over others and in power. In the teaching of Christ, and in his life, we learn that, if we want to be truly great, we must truly be humble. Humility is a word that many dislike, since it's often conflated with low self-esteem. But true humility is not putting ourselves down, but instead being aware that all that we are, and all that we have and all that we love is a gift to be shared for the love of God and of others. May we ask Jesus to transform our hearts so that we can look at what we can give for others, instead of what we can get for ourselves. It is only in self-giving to Jesus and to others that we find self-fulfillment. This is easy to say but hard to do. Jesus, Meek and Humble of Heart, make our hearts like unto Thine!
