MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Hope Appeal 2023

Thank you for your generosity to the annual Hope Appeal. The Hope Appeal reveals the love and compassion of our Lord throughout our seven-county Diocese. Your gift to the annual appeal supports the Mass for shut-ins, hospital and nursing home chaplains, college campus ministry programs, faith formation programs, youth and young adult programs, right-to-life activities, vocation promotion, Catholic School tuition assistance, and so much more. Every parish in the Diocese of Syracuse has a Hope Appeal goal; our Hope Appeal goal is \$122,000. In an effort to achieve the goal, I would like to suggest that every family in the parish consider making a minimum gift/or pledge to the Hope Appeal of \$150.00 (averages out to \$12.50 a month of \$.41 a day). If you can afford more than the minimum suggested gift per family, please do so. If you cannot give the minimum gift per family, please know that anything you do will be a big help. Every gift counts! I want to be totally transparent and let you know that all Hope Appeal gifts/pledges are restricted gifts and can only be used for the purposes of the Hope Appeal. If we exceed our goal, all of the overages will come back to Holy Family for our use. Last year, we received \$62,000 in overage and we have used that money for additional projects around the parish. The Hope Appeal is the biggest fundraiser for our church community. So, as you can see, a gift to the Hope Appeal is a gift to Holy Family. On behalf of all impacted by the appeal, I thank you for your great generosity and support! Your goodness makes Holy Family Church a leader in the Hope Appeal, and it is a great testimony to the faith of our parish! Thank you and I know God will repay us a hundredfold for our generosity! Please make your gift or pledge as soon as possible.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 21: 28 - 32

“Character is doing what you don’t want to do but know you should do” – Joyce Meyer

“Conscience is the inner voice that warns us somebody may be looking” – HL Menchen

Your faith in God is an essential component of a well-formed conscience. The first son in today’s Gospel had a strong faith and a well-formed conscience. His actions didn’t match his words, but ultimately his well-formed conscience made him honor his father by following his request to work in his vineyard.

My father would say to me, “Actions speak louder than words”, and although I’m sure he didn’t write that, he preached it, and he lived it, and he taught me by example.

My father would also say, “The road to hell is paved with good intentions”. I’m sure he didn’t write that either, but I think these two messages my father spoke summarize the teaching in today’s Gospel according to Matthew.

Jesus said to the chief priests and elders, “Amen I say to you, tax collectors and prostitutes are entering the kingdom of God before you”, because they saw and believed.

Brothers and sisters in Christ, honor others by your words and actions. Do this because you have seen salvation through the eyes of the Apostles and know that the road to salvation is through our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. Jesus is the way and the truth and the life; no one comes to the Father except through him. May God bless you.
