MESSAGE FROM OUR PASTOR

Dear Holy Family Parishioners and Friends,

I hope this note finds you well and in good health! I pray you had a blessed summer that gives way to the beauty of fall!

As you know, the work of proclaiming the Gospel of Jesus Christ does not stop — thanks be to God! Here at Holy Family Church and in parishes around our Diocese and world, the need for God and the presence of the Church is so evident. Simply put, people still need to, and will always need to, encounter Jesus. That is why the Diocese of Syracuse is kicking off the annual Hope Appeal Campaign on the weekend of September 9/10, 2023. The annual Hope Appeal allows the Diocese of Syracuse to make the presence of Christ felt in so many ways. Did you know that the Hope Appeal funds programs like hospital and nursing home chaplains, college campus chaplains, Catholic School tuition assistance, support of food pantries (including Holy Family's Pantry) and soup kitchens, funds some Catholic Charities programs, programs for youth and young adults to grow in the faith, vocation promotion, formation of seminarians for the priesthood, formation of deacons, marriage preparation, marriage support and counseling, Mass for shut-ins, and so much more? Our parishioners have benefited from all of the Hope Appeal programs listed above and those not listed. I cannot even begin to tell you what a blessing the Hope Appeal is, not just to our Diocese, but to our parish.

Soon you will be receiving information from the Diocese of Syracuse on how you can support the Hope Appeal (if you haven't received it already). Even if you do not receive information from the Diocese, you can still support the appeal. Every parish in the Diocese of Syracuse has a Hope Appeal goal; our Hope Appeal goal is \$122,000. In an effort to achieve the goal, I would like to suggest that every family in the parish consider making a minimum gift/or pledge to the Hope Appeal of \$150.00 (averages out to \$12.50 a month of \$.41 a day). I know this is a sacrifice and I would never ask you to do something that I would not do. Therefore, I am making a gift to the appeal for \$1,500 to support the work of bringing Christ and the Church to others. If you can afford more than the minimum suggested gift per family, please do so. If you cannot give the minimum gift per family, please know that anything you do will be a big help. Every gift counts! I want to be totally transparent and let you know that all Hope Appeal gifts/pledges are restricted gifts and can only be used for the purposes of the Hope Appeal. They cannot be used for any other purpose outside of the scope of the Hope Appeal Campaign. They cannot be used for the Chapter 11 Reorganization.

If we exceed our goal, all of the overage will come back to Holy Family for our use. Last year, we received \$60,000 in overage and we have used that money for additional projects around the parish. The Hope Appeal is the biggest fundraiser for our church community. So, as you can see, a gift to the Hope Appeal is a gift to Holy Family. On behalf of all impacted by the appeal, I thank you for your great generosity and support! Your goodness makes Holy Family Church a leader in the Hope Appeal, and it is a great testimony to the faith of our parish! Thank you and I know God will repay us a hundredfold for our generosity!

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 18: 21 - 35

This weekend's Gospel has had a profound impact on my understanding of forgiveness. It begins with Peter's question about the limits of forgiveness, something I've often wondered about too. When Jesus responds with the parable of the unforgiving servant, I can't help but see my own struggles with forgiveness mirrored in that servant's actions.

The parable reveals the vast contrast between the boundless forgiveness God offers us and our reluctance to extend the same to others. It challenges me to look deep within myself and confront moments when I've held onto grudges or sought revenge, rather than forgiving unconditionally.

This passage reminds me that forgiveness isn't just a moral principle; it's at the core of living a Christian life. When I hold onto anger and resentment, I cut myself off from the transformative power of God's grace, just as the unforgiving servant lost the master's forgiveness.

In my personal journey, this passage encourages me to break free from the cycle of unforgiveness. It's a daily reminder that I need to forgive not only for others but for my own inner peace and spiritual well-being. When I let go of past hurts, I experience the liberating and healing nature of forgiveness, a reflection of God's love and mercy in my life.
