RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) will be held in the Pastoral Center.

Jesus promised, "Whoever believes in Me...rivers of living water will flow from within him," (John 7:37-38); and "I came that they may have life, and have it more abundantly," (John 10:10)

The RCIA process begins the journey of faith that leads to the fulfillment of our Lord's promises and is for all adults who:

- Have never received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, or Jesus in the Eucharist and desire to, or;

- Have been baptized in a non-Catholic faith tradition but desire full communion in the Roman Catholic Church upon receiving Confirmation and Jesus in the Eucharist, or;

- Are already baptized Catholic and still need to receive the sacraments of Confirmation and/or Eucharist, or;

- Are already Catholic or non-Catholic Christians and simply desire to learn more about the good news of our Lord Jesus Christ.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

Matthew 16: 21 - 27

Most parents are concerned about the kind of friends their children have not because they don't trust their children, but because they know that peer pressure can often be insurmountable and that the wrong kind of companions can spell trouble. We seem to forget, though, that peer pressure doesn't end with childhood. As adults, we may appear more independent, but the fact is we never outgrow the urge to go along with the crowd. As we grow older, the "crowd" is identified with the vision, goals, and trends of the society in which we live.

St. Paul, in today's reading, is well aware of this human tendency, cautioning the Christian community in Rome not to be consumed by the prevailing culture. And Jesus, in today's Gospel, reaffirms this and warns St. Peter not to judge by the world's standards.

If we are going to profess to be Christian, we would understandably want to embrace Christian values and realize that they can be significantly different from the values of our secular society. Society's values are continually changing and rarely promote our spiritual well-being. We therefore look, instead, to the gospel where the values of Jesus are consistent and enduring and reveal the way to happy and effective living. We are always at our best and most Christ-like when we are willing to "lose" our lives in the service of love. Essentially, we Christians are not killjoys, we simply march to a different drummer!

What drummers do you march to in your daily life? Do you evaluate yourself and your successes in terms of gospel values? Or do you seek your happiness in a consumer society's latest fads and offerings?

"Do not conform yourselves to this age" – good advice today from St. Paul for effective living!
